AP Calculus Classroom Guidelines 2016-2017 Mrs. Welsh

AP CALCULUS is an advanced and weighted college level rigorous course. You are expected to work to the best of your ability at all times.

Grading

- Grading is done by total points.
- > Most points come from homework, graded homework, guizzes, and tests.
- > Simply take the number of points earned and divide by the number of possible points.
- Multiply by 100 to get a percent.
- > The grading scale is as follows: 90-100% A, 80-89% B, 70-79% C, 60-69% D.
- > Check your grades periodically on line. If you believe there is a mistake, please see me.

Homework/Tests

- Assignments are typically worth 4 points.
- Each problem must be done to receive total points.
- Your success in this class depends mostly on doing and correcting the homework.
- Periodically, assignments are graded for accuracy and worth more points.
- Expect at least 5 quizzes or tests each nine weeks worth about 30-70 points each.
- If you are absent on a test day, you will take it during class the next day back. Be prepared!!
- You will be given a Math XL assignment at least once a 9 weeks.

Class Time

- Come to class prepared and ready to go when the bell rings!
- We work from bell to bell.Keep your phones away!!!
- You will need a graphing calculator, notebook and a binder, pencil...
- I do not have extra calculators to borrow.
- If you are absent, get the notes missed from someone.
- Use your planners.

College Credits

- There is an opportunity for any student to obtain 4 college credits for this course in 2 different ways.
- One is by taking the AP Exam in the spring. Sign up is in Feb/March.
