Ingredients:

- 1. 8 eggs
- 2. 1 cup of vegetable oil
- 3. 1 cup sweetened applesauce
- 4. 1 cup water
- 5. 1 quart of sugar
- 6. 1 quart of pumpkin pie mix
- 7. 2 cups of walnuts
- 8. 6 cups of flour
- 9. Half of a tablespoon of nutmeg
- 10. Half of a tablespoon of cinnamon
- 11. Half of a teaspoon of ground cloves
- 12. Half of a teaspoon of ginger
- 13. 1 tablespoon and 1 teaspoon of baking soda
- 14. 1 teaspoon of salt

Directions:

Combine all wet ingredients and add in all dry ingredients. Stir and pour into muffin pan. Makes approximately 23 muffins. Bake at 325 degrees in a convection oven (or oven with a fan) for 14-17 min. Check with toothpick. If it the toothpick comes out with muffin batter it is not done. If the toothpick comes out clean, they are done.

- 1. Preheat oven to 300.F (150.C)
- 2. Toss seeds into bowl with melted butter and salt.
- 3. Spread seeds on a single layer of a baking sheet and bake for 45 minuets and or until golden brown.




